In this third year of supporting young families through Beyond New Beginnings, we have experienced much success and program growth. We have reached out to more community groups and individuals who have in turn found ways to support moms and children.



Three of the moms made an inspiring video that is on our website. They explain how much they benefit from what we offer, and they share their personal goals. BNB was also nominated for KARE-11's "Communities that Kare" feature. That video presents a good overview of who we are and what we are doing.

Moms are reaching their personal goals: one mom has completed one year of CAD programming coursework, another mom graduated with an AA in Business Administration and just found a better, higher paying job. We are focused on supporting the children's learning opportunities this summer with Learning Fun (reading and math skills) and with swim lessons!

We continue to find ways to enhance the lives of the BNB families, from attending Children's Theater to pontoon boat fishing to exploring Sever's Corn Maze. One of the highlights of the year was a family/mentor holiday cookie baking day led by our Family Coach.

How is BNB supporting moms and families?

Even though I had a decent paying full-time job as a Nursing Assistant, I was afraid I wouldn't be able to make my monthly payments for my own apartment. I had never been the head of a household before. BNB set up a meeting with Sam, from the U of M Extension Program to help me review my budget. I felt so much better after that, I finally signed the lease and have been making all the required payments in order to keep my apartment.

The next obstacle I had was custody issues with my children. I got a lot of legal advice from my BNB support people and a volunteer family attorney. I started out pretty nervous and anxious, and ended up standing up for myself in court and getting the best possible outcome for my children.

My three daughters benefit from the stability, Monday night classes and fun events BNB provides. They enjoy the BNB staff and the other families, too. They can see how much I appreciate this setting for all of us. I love the constant support and the resources I get from BNB. They are always there to



help me problem-solve and find a better way forward.

In my spare time, I like cooking, baking, doing hairstyles for events (up-do's), keeping my house clean and organized (I used to be a professional house cleaner), and I also coach my daughters' soccer teams.

My hope for the future is that I continue to find stability and mental health support for myself and my daughters. It is important that we feel grounded and cared for. I am so thankful for BNB.
